Kinexion is the management service organization (MSO) for an affiliate network comprised of: Independent Group Home Living (IGHL), The Association for Technology Dependent Children ("Angela's House"), New Interdisciplinary School (NIS), Center for Developmental Disabilities (CDD), Head Injury Associates (HIA), Maryhaven and East End Disability Associates (EEDA). This network positions seven well-respected organizations to lead the way in which we are able to provide lifetime supports for people with disabilities. This central organization is responsible for administrative operations and offers financial security as a collective 250-million-dollar organization, employing more than 4,000 staff members and providing services to more than 10,000 individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities across Long Island.

Affiliate providers are connected through shared departments to support Finance, Information Technology, Human Resources, Corporate Compliance, Purchasing, Maintenance and Logistics. In addition, each affiliated provider will purchase services that Kinexion offers, affording them greater support from specialized professional departments at reduced costs. As a result, affiliated providers will have the best opportunities for continued growth and direct savings; so, money can be spent on person-centered services.

Inspired by research and feedback from people with special needs, family members, providers and community members, the Kinexion name connotes the driving force behind its affiliates, as well as the network of resources it provides to its constituencies. The tagline *A Family of Agencies, A Lifetime of Care* clearly identifies that we are multiple agencies offering the continuum of supports and services for people with disabilities. The Kinexion logo represents that in all we do, the network's philosophy is to be person centered.

Within the Kinexion network you will find a continuum of superior lifetime care that supports people with disabilities and their families and makes a more inclusive community economically viable and sustainable.

ADVOCACY *in action*



For nearly ten years, advocates have been traveling to Albany to plead with lawmakers to not further cut funding to agencies

like EEDA who provide vital support to people with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD) throughout New York State. There were years we warned our representatives that if current funding trends continue, we would see an unparalleled staffing crisis. Unfortunately, COVID-19 pushed our industry to the brink, and over the past year, we have been sounding the alarm that the crisis we have been warning our lawmakers about has come. In 2022, however, our lawmakers and the governor's office took notice. This year's budget did not forget our industry, and for the first time in what seems like forever, the budget includes a sizeable cost of living adjustment, or COLA. At the first rally of its kind since COVID-19, we demonstrated alongside champion lawmakers and state officials to say, "vote yes!" to this year's budget. Vote yes to funding our citizens with I/DD and the professionals that support them.



Stony Brook University

EEDA was fortunate to receive a grant from NYS Governors Workforce Development Initiative to collaborate with other provider agencies and contract with the Stony Brook University School of Professional Development to offer management training classes to cohorts of DSPs, frontline supervisors, and managers. Cohorts include EEDA staff and participants from local sister agencies. Coursework included Business Communications, Finances for Business, Diversity, Equity and Inclusion, Time Management, and Stress Reduction. EEDA staff shined in these classes as the brightest and most engaged participants. Each group was celebrated upon the successful completion of coursework and have been applying new skills in their day to day work here at EEDA. Participants also received a certificate of completion from the Stony Brook University School of Professional Development. In 2018, EEDA was awarded a development opportunity to provide a home for six young men whose families were looking for a permanent home for their sons. EEDA administration found and purchased a beautiful house on Michaels Lane in a lovely neighborhood in Wading River and began planning for the renovations it needed. The house was plenty big enough but there was much to do to bring it up to the standards that EEDA requires of all its group homes. Walls needed to be moved, a pool had to be redesigned, and safety features had to be installed to meet the standards set by OPWDD.

Meetings were held, applications were filed, and things were looking very optimistic, and then in February 2020, COVID-19 hit and Michaels Lane, like everything else in the world, ground to a halt. Contractors stopped working, inspectors stopped inspecting, OPWDD went into lockdown, and the whole world changed.

During the next year, EEDA circled the wagons and concentrated on our IRA residents and individuals we support through the Community Habilitation program whose residents live independently in the community. Although the Michaels Lane development was still a part of our plans, most of our resources were devoted to keeping the individuals and our staff safe and healthy.

As COVID-19 began to ease and we got a much better handle on the new normal, things began to happen at the Michaels Lane house. Our contractors came back to work, supplies became more available, and slowly, ever so slowly, the house was completed.





Our next obstacle was one of the biggest challenges that all nonprofits face in today's world. OPWDD would not approve the opening of our Michaels Lane house or any other house throughout the state until the provider agency could provide a schedule that showed full staffing coverage for the safe operation of the home. EEDA was already struggling to staff our current group homes and hiring twelve Direct Support Professionals, a Manager, and clinical staff to support a new IRA was a monumental challenge. However, with the combined efforts of EEDA's Human Resources and Residential Departments, we were able to identify and hire the necessary staff and the house opened on March 5, 2022.

Under normal circumstances, opening a new IRA is a challenge, but during the pandemic those challenges seemed insurmountable at times. But we were blessed with a group of families who were committed to the project and partnered with EEDA to see it through. EEDA is dedicated to providing a lifelong home for all our IRA residents as we continue to create opportunities for happy lives.



HARDING ST.

EEDA's former respite house sat empty during the pandemic, but on February 02, 2022, the house officially opened its doors as our new Harding Street IRA. Harding Street is now home to five young women, and it is EEDA's first IRA to have a pet Yorkie! All of the ladies have grown to love her as their own.

The Harding Street house has a huge backyard, and a bike trail behind the house where the women like to walk or ride bikes with staff. There's a 7-11 in walking distance that's also a popular destination. The women of Harding Street enjoy baking and cooking together—they even volunteer at local church kitchens! They also participate in a bowling league that they love going to every Saturday morning. We're so excited to welcome the Harding Street ladies to EEDA's residential family!
